Journal of Commitments to the House of Refuge, 1854-1899

The Journal of Commitments to the House of Refuge, 1854-1899, a single roll of microfilm located in film drawer 2 in the Special Collections Department, provides a glimpse into the lives of the institution's residents. With a few exceptions, the population consisted of girls between the ages of three and 14 and boys between the ages of three and 16. While the name "House of Refuge" might sound assuring and welcoming, the sizeable number of those who escaped, some repeatedly, suggests otherwise.

Indexes

The microfilm includes an every-name index, preceding the journal, arranged alphabetically by the first letter of the last name. A printed index may also be accessed in "The House of Refuge," an article and transcribed index by Peggy Greenwood published in the "St. Louis Genealogical Society Quarterly" over the course of six issues (call no. R 977.865 S145, 1992 vol. 25, issues 2, 3, and 4; 1993, vol. 26, issues 1, 2, and 3),

Journal of commitments

The entry for each child appears on a single line across the left and right-hand pages and records both commitment and release information. Commitment data includes the child's name, age, date of arrival, authority committing the child, and the cause. Release information tells the date, authority approving the release, child's destination upon release, and remarks.

The cause of commitment may tell something about each child's personal life. While some came because of minor crimes and others entered on their own or at the request of a parent or step-parent, still others came because they were abandoned or had no home.

The child's destination after release often provides genealogical clues. Records commonly mention relatives or guardians, or provide helpful notations such as *sent to city workhouse*, *allowed to depart*, *sent to* [named] *orphanage*, or list the identity and residence of the person who provided employment. The destination column often says "indentured to" with the name of the person taking the child, that person's residence, and the date. Quite a few indentured children went to individuals in rural communities in Illinois and Missouri.

The remarks column frequently reveals notations of escapes and occasionally deaths. Three unique journal entries appear in 1863, in the midst of the Civil War. In those cases, "released to the Provost Marshall" explained the destination for three older teenagers and the remarks column simply stated "being claimed as deserters."

WEB NEWS

■ 1940 U.S. Census: According to a posting on the Archives.com website http://www.archives.com/
1940census> The 1940 census will be released to the public at 9 a.m. Eastern Daylight Time on April 2, 2012. The data will be hosted on a website created collaboratively by Archives.com and the National Archives. The address will be announced at a later date.

Although census images will be made available for free on the Internet, no index will be available at the time the data is posted. In a joint statement released on December 16, Archives.com, FamilySearch and findmypast.com announced that the three organizations have created the 1940 Census Community Project to index the records and place them online as quickly as possible. FamilySearch will make its online indexing system available for volunteers to participate in the project. Information about the project, including how to volunteer, is available on the 1940 Census Community Project website .

Special Collections Department staff member Dan Lilienkamp will offer tips for searching the 1940 census without an index at the February 11 meeting of the St. Louis genealogical Society (see "Events" on this page).

■ SSDI removed from Rootsweb: Rootsweb.com has removed the Social Security Death Index (SSDI) from its website citing "sensitivities to issues surrounding the information" http://searches.rootsweb.ancestry.com/ssdi.html. The database is still available on Ancestry.com (which also owns Rootsweb), but access requires a paid subscription. Ancestry Library Edition, which includes access to the SSDI, is available for free at all St. Louis County Library branches.
