### St. Louis turns 250 in 2014

As the story goes, in Feb. 1764, August Chouteau and a few dozen others founded a fur-trading post near the site where the Arch now stands, and thus St. Louis was founded. STL250 a volunteer-led, non-profit organization, was formed to commemorate the anniversary year and will act as Master of Ceremonies for a year-long, region-wide celebration throughout the 15-county bi-state region. ## THIS MONTH IN ST. LOUIS HISTORY JANUARY 1882

Beginning in January 1882, St. Louis and other cities across the United States were dealing with a smallpox epidemic. Residents of St. Louis were flocking to be vaccinated. By then, 80,000 people had been vaccinated and 4,000 deaths had occurred due to the virulent disease. Health Commissioner Francis was in charge of implementing the procedures for handling this epidemic. Most victims and some families of the infected children were removed to the "Pest-house" located south of Jefferson Barracks, a facility described in the Feb. 12, 1882 issue of the St. Louis Globe-Democrat on page 3.

The names of those who died from small-pox were listed in bulletins published in the newspaper. With few exceptions, most of those names do not appear in the St. Louis burial permit listings also found in the Globe. Bodies were interred at the Quarantine cemetery on the western part of the hospital compound.





The roads leading from the gates were what are now known as Carondelet Avenue (then the well known Vile Flock Road); the Manchester Road, the St. Charles Road, with its branches; and a road which led towards every Bremen now is. What looks like blocks of wood represents fields in cultivation, and the dots show timber. The mark of the compass is only given for the purpose of guiding the reader as to the cardinal points. It must be borne in mind that in some of the localities the direction of the streets has been slightly altered, which may account for some apparent discrepancies which may appear to subsist between the map and the main narrative as to the locality of the old fortifications.

This old map represents the town of St. Louis, nearly as it was laid out in 1764. Its breadth from the Mississippi, to the West, was to the line of Rue de Grange (now Third street), and its length was some few blocks shorter than the map represents. The wall of fortifications was completed in 1780. The letters have the following significations:




