MICROFILM GEMS

Missouri Republican newspaper is a great source for early Missouri history and genealogy

Published in St. Louis, the Missouri Republican newspaper, renamed the St. Louis Republic in late May 1888, offers a rich source of St. Louis news and stories about daily life in the 1800s and early 1900s. Available on microfilm and shelved on Tier 4, holdings for this newspaper include issues for March 1828–June 1838 in microfilm drawer 41, and for Jan. 1850–Dec. 1851, Jan.–June 1854, and Jan. 1880–Dec. 1919 in drawers 84–87. The paper was printed in some years under title variations of St. Louis Missouri

Republican and St. Louis Missouri Republic. In 1919, the St. Louis Globe-Democrat bought and absorbed the St. Louis Republic.

News Coverage

If looking for death announcements, focus your search near the beginning of the classifieds. In the early years, marriage announcements appeared right before the deaths. The number of these notices varied and could vary from only one marriage or death to a sizeable number.

While articles in the earlier years covered national and state matters more heavily, the amount of local news increased as St. Louis grew in size and population. Prior to emancipation, advertisements for slave sales and runaway slaves appeared along with schedules of steamboat arrivals and departures, general river news, legal notices, financial news, business listings and advertisements.



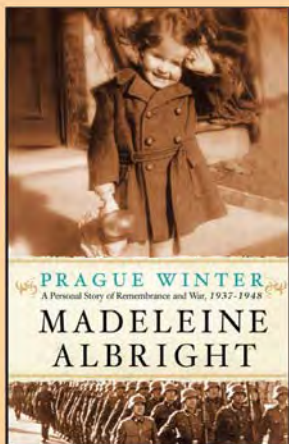

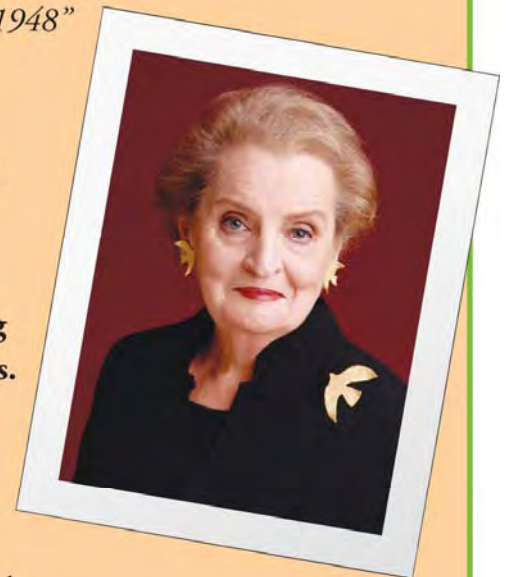

Later, coverage expanded to include school, church, sports, and entertainment events, “Society Notes,” divorces, crime, and cases in the various courts. A “Local Personals” column provided the names of hotel guests and at which hotel they lodged while in town. The classifieds included sections for religious congregations and lodges.

Examples

The 4 January 1831 issue of the Missouri Republican reported the deaths of Col. Robert P. Farris and Mr. William McKnight of St. Louis, as well as the deaths of John B. E. Canal of Vandalia, Ill., Mrs. Isabella Thomson, relict of the late Mr. Thomas Thomson, “near Philadelphia,” and Mr. Anthony V. Carr, the Indian Sub-Agent at the Osage Agency. One impressive 1850 column listed ten marriages and nineteen deaths covering ten counties in Missouri beyond St. Louis and seven states beyond Missouri.

A front page article in the 12 March 1838 Missouri Republican announced to readers under the headline of “United States Mail” that J. R. Jefferson had “. . . commenced running a daily line of four horse post coaches from this place [St. Louis city] to Saint Charles, leaving the City Hotel daily at 1 P.M. and arrive at St. Charles to supper. . .” Coming the other way, a coach would leave St. Charles at 5 a. m. and arrive in St. Louis at 11 a.m.

Unique news items also appeared. The April 18, 1884 issue provides such an example. An article, “Children for Kansas,” tells of Mr. E. L. Trott passing through St. Louis on his way to Kansas with eighteen boys from the Children’s Aid society of New York. They stopped for supper at one of the hotels in St. Louis before continuing their journey on the “Missouri Pacific road.”


Search Strategy

If you have a date of a marriage, death, or other event that may have appeared in a newspaper, see if the Missouri Republican or St. Louis Republic mentions it. The same event may be written differently in two or more newspapers, and each may be helpful.

Even if you search unsuccessfully for a family item, take time to browse the paper for the day, week, or month of your search as it provides a feel for that time. Fashions, world events, and the cost of advertised goods provide an historic background that can be valuable.

<<http://www.genealogybank.com>> features the St. Louis Republic for 1 May 1888 – 31 Oct. 1900 and has indexed it for those years. Even if you do not have a subscription to the database, you can still use it as an index. Searching the database will return a citation for a specific date, but it does not list a page. Copy down the information, find the issue using St. Louis County Library’s microfilm copy of the newspaper, and then browse for the article.

New at Ancestry Library Edition

- **Massachusetts, Town Vital Collections, 1620-1988:** This database includes a wide variety records going back to the colony's earliest days. These include birth and baptismal registers, intention of marriage and marriage records, courthouse records, and death registers. The database is based on documents filmed by Jay and DeLene Holbrook, who have visited 315 of the state's 351 towns and cities to film holdings of vital and town records.
- **Department of Veterans Affairs BIRLS Death File, 1850-2010:** Includes birth and death dates for more than 14 million veterans and VA beneficiaries who died between the years 1850 and 2010. Information can include name, gender, birth date, death date, Social Security Number, cause of death, branch of service, enlistment date, and release date.
- **New Jersey, Marriage Records, 1683-1802:** Features marriage details extracted from early New Jersey marriage records.
- **New Jersey, Abstract of Wills, 1670-1817:** This database contains 13 volumes of details abstracted from early New Jersey wills.

FEATURED ACQUISITION

The three-volume set, “**America’s Women in the Revolutionary Era, 1760-1790: A History through Bibliography**,” edited by the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) Library Director Eric G. Grundset, cites books, articles, dissertations and online documents. The publications goal is to aid researchers in understanding the existing literature and point out gaps to encourage future research. The bibliography is sorted by

- 1) subject, including general studies; women in the family and in society; women, culture, education, and creative arts; women, girls, and the war effort during the American Revolution; women and girls of the regions and states of the United States;
- 2) geography, including Spanish and French borderland areas and Cuba, not just the original thirteen colonies;
- 3) author; and
- 4) a chronological listing of articles by date of publication in order to make it as useful as possible.

The books, which together contain over 3000 pages, are shelved in the Special Collections Department at R 973.3 G889A.
